The report identified the issue

- There are an estimated **5.3 million** individuals in the UK who are ID Challenge
- The majority of those who are ID Challenge are in the private sector
- Around 70% of those who are ID Challenge are in the private sector

1) Delegated agent functions

Directly

- Health
- Financial aid
- Child care
- Long-term care
- Law

Indirectly (through another agent)

- **Special Agent** – has some or several rights with respect to the agency services that are the responsibility of the principal
- **Sub-Special Agent** – cannot perform those functions that are the responsibility of the principal but can perform those services that it is able to perform in carrying out its duties in the relationship. For the Commissioner of Correcting Institutions, this would include performing duties of a parole officer, parole board member, parole board clerk, parole board secretary, parole board clerk, parole board secretary or other duties of a parole officer.

2) Non-delegated functions

These are those duties that are not delegated, namely, what is the responsibility of the principal.
